Windle International Uganda - We equip refugees and people affected by conflict to meet the challenges of development through enabling them to access education, training and gainful employment opportunities.

WINDLE UGANDA FIELD PRESENCE

Windle International Uganda currently has 11 field offices spread across settlements as follows: South West, (Nakivale, Oruchinga, Kyaka II and Rwamwanja): Mid-Western (Kiryandongo and Kyangwali): Northern Uganda/West Nile (Adjumani, Palorinya, Rhino Camp, Imvepi and Bidibidi) and 1 head office located in Kampala.

Windle International Uganda has staffing capacity of 2,587 staff most of whom are teachers offering educational services across the country in the districts of Kampala, Isingiro, Kamwenge, Kyegegwa, Hoima, Kiryandongo, Adjumani, Moyo, Yumbe and Arua.

The target beneficiaries of Windle International Uganda are both Refugees and members of the host communities (as guided by the ReHOPE strategy).

WTU PARTNERS

- The Government of Uganda (OPM) leads the operations
- UNHCR facilitates the operations
- WIU and other partners (UNICEF, Save the Children, Finn Church Aid, World Vision, NRC & Plan International) implement the interventions.
- Operation and Implementation mechanisms follows: The Refugee Act 2006, the Refugee and Host Community Empowerment Strategy (ReHOPE strategy), Settlement Transformation Agenda and the Comprehensive Refugee Response Framework.

- 🇺🇬 48,609 Nationals are accessing Primary education in the settlements
- 🇺🇬 A total of 246 Schools across the settlements across the country with categories as follows: -
 - 130 Early Childhood Development Centres (ECD) across settlements across the country
 - 107 Primary Schools all settlements across the country
 - 7 Secondary Schools all settlements across the country
 - 2 Vocational training centres all settlements across the country
- 🇺🇬 A total of 1,404 classrooms constructed in all settlements schools across the country
- 🇺🇬 1,936 latrines stances constructed in all settlements across the country
- 🇺🇬 33,646 desks procured and delivered in schools across all settlements
- 🇺🇬 5,904 refugees and members of the host community regularly participate in education affairs through School Management Committees and Parents Teachers Associations
- 🇺🇬 400 OVC & PSN taken to access specialized Education Services out of the settlements across the country
- 🇺🇬 Windle Uganda operates 2 Accelerated Learning Programs in Kiryandongo
- 🇺🇬 Windle Uganda operates 3 Community Technology Access Centres (CTA) for youth in Kiryandongo & Nakivale

Scholarship Management

- 🇺🇬 1,417 Refugee girls and boys supported to access secondary Education outside the settlement
- 🇺🇬 29 Refugees supported to access post-secondary vocational training in different vocational Institutions
- 🇺🇬 194 Refugees supported to access University Education locally through the Albert Einstein German Academic Refugee Initiative Fund (DAFI) with 126 being continuing students.
- 🇺🇬 447 Refugees and 100 Ugandans provided scholarships to study Master's degree in the United Kingdom
- 🇺🇬 Since 1997, over 2,500 supported to access University, over 8,000 supported to access secondary and over 1,300 supported to access vocational training
- 🇺🇬 Between 2006 and 2010, over 5,000 young people from Northern Uganda were supported to access Education and skills training through the Acholi bursary scheme with funds from the Dutch Government.

Key areas to strengthen

- 🇺🇬 Infrastructure (classrooms, latrine stances, teacher's accommodation, furniture) to cater for the influx
- 🇺🇬 More teachers to meet the demand - teacher pupil ratios still high 1:80+
- 🇺🇬 Investment in secondary education - provision of post primary school education and training to absorb those that complete primary education
- 🇺🇬 Investment in Tertiary/University Education especially technical skills such as Nursing, teaching services, Plumbing, Mechanics, Building and hairdressing among others.
- 🇺🇬 Provision of more scholarships for both secondary and tertiary Education – this year (2017) 1,242 students applied for scholarship, 713 were eligible for University, however only 68 were absorbed.

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
