AREAS OF OPERATION

Windle International Uganda (WIU) operates in 12 settlements and education management is fully operational in 11 settlement within 10 Districts of Isingiro, Kamwenge, Kyegegwa, Hoima, Kiryandongo, Adjumani, Moyo, Lamwo, Arua and Kampala as the Headquarters.

Our regional offices are located in Adjumani, Hoima, Arua and Mbarara and the settlement office locations are distributed as follows:

•SOUTH WEST: Nakivale, Oruchinga, Kyaka II and Rwamwanja

•MID-WESTERN: Kiryandongo and Kyangwali

•NORTHERN UGANDA: Adjumani, Palorinya & Palabek

•WEST NILE: Rhino Camp and Imvepi



SCHOLARSHIP HIGHLIGHTS

- •395 children with Special Needs were identified and are being supported to go to school and 2,274 orphans and vulnerable children are on the OVC scholarship.
- •16 (15M & 1F) students are currently on the Vocational scholarship under Windle International UK in Imvepi and Bidibidi Refugee settlements.
- •457 (295M & 162F) students are currently on the DAFI Scholarships Program after 50 new scholarships were awarded in July/August .
- •5 (3M & 2F) students are currently on Windle International UK Scholarships program in universities within Uganda.
- •53 (34M & 19F) students are on the WUSC scholarship with 21 (15M & 6F) currently in Canada and 32 (19M & 13F) still in the process of resettlement to Canada.
- •5 students are currently on the UK Masters Scholarship
- •70 beneficiaries of the DAFI scholarship programme and 2 beneficiaries of the Gulu scholarship programme successfully graduated from various local universities within Uganda.

AUXILIARY PROJECTS AND OTHER HIGHLIGHTS

Windle International Uganda was awarded Best International Education Humanitarian NGO of the year 2019 by the Government of Uganda at the Visionaries of Uganda awards. The awards that were launched by H.E President Y.K Museveni in 2012 recognize organizations and initiatives who are key drivers towards the socioeconomic transformation of the country in-line with the government's Vision 2040 strategic development plan to transform the Ugandan society from a peasant to a modern and prosperous country within 30 years.

EDUCATION CANNOT WAIT (ECW)

A total of **75** three seater desks were procured for Kakoni P/S and benefitted **225** learners improving the desk to pupil ratio from **1:10** to **1:6**

ECW also supported WIU to construct **15** classroom blocks with offices, **49** stances of latrines, **8** units of teachers' accommodation.

Additionally **272** teachers were trained on psychosocial, pedagogy, thematic curriculum, innovation in teaching and learning skills.

CONVOY OF HOPE

WIU with support from Convoy of Hope WIU provided food and feeding items to **29** ECD centres in Rhino Camp, Imvepi and Palorinya which has worked to improve enrollment and retention of learners to about **81%** from **75%**.

ENABEL

WIU with support from ENABEL conducted a one-day capacity building workshop for **62** (**40M,22F**) work based supervisors from 38n work-based supervisors from **38** private companies (**15** Kiryandongo **23** Adjumani). The workshop was conducted in partnership with Uganda Manufacturers Association (UMA), WIU's implementing partner. The workshop was aimed at enhancing the capacity of work based supervisors to provide trainees with experience of business realities during the one-month internship period in the business organizations. The 1st intake for internship with different entrepreneurs within Bweyale in all the five trades of hair dressing, metal fabrication, cookery, bakery and tailoring was successfully completed.
