AREAS OF OPERATION

Windle International Uganda (WIU) operates in **12** settlements and Education management is fully operational in **11** settlement within **10** Districts of Isingiro, Kamwenge, Kyegegwa, Hoima, Kiryandongo, Adjumani, Moyo, Lamwo, Arua and Kampala as the Headquarters.

Our regional offices are located in Adjumani, Hoima, Arua and Mbarara and the settlement office locations are distributed as follows:

- **SOUTH WEST:** Nakivale, Oruchinga, Kyaka II and Rwamwanja
- **MID-WESTERN:** Kiryandongo and Kyangwali
- **NORTHERN UGANDA:** Adjumani, Palorinya & Palabek
- **WEST NILE:** Rhino Camp and Imvepi

- In Vocational Training a total of **641** learners have been enrolled 427 Refugees (M: 393 & F: 248) and 206 Nationals (M: 147 & F: 59)
- WIU successfully registered and paid for **6,630** PLE candidates, **728** UCE candidates and **46** UACE candidates for the 2019 examinations.
- **20** classroom blocks, **45** latrines and **26** teachers' housing units have been constructed in Adjumani, Rhino Camp, Imvepi, Lamwo, Kyangwali and Kyaka II settlements.
- Instructional and scholastic materials including **238,003** exercise books, **42,407** pens, **86,273** pencils, **5,844** rulers, **167,544** mathematical sets, **along other instructional materials** have been procured and distributed to Adjumani, Rhino Camp, Moyo, Imvepi, Lamwo, Kiryandongo, Kyangwali, Nakivale & Kyaka II.



SCHOLARSHIP HIGHLIGHTS

- **21 (M 15M & 6F)** WUSC students were selected and will leave for the Canadian resettlement and scholarship soon.
- DAFI scholarship interviews took place and the verified lists are to be released within quarter 3 for the 50 successful applicants.
- **380** Persons with Special Needs are being supported to go to school.



AUXILIARY PROJECTS

Convoy of Hope

With support from Convoy of Hope, WIU provided food and feeding items to 29 EDC centers in **Rhino Camp, Imvepi and Palorinya-Moyo** which helped to improve the rate of enrolment from 8021 to 9755. WIU was also able to procure construction materials for the construction of two kitchens.

ECW (Education Cannot Wait)

In Kyaka II and Kyangwali settlements, ECW has supported WIU to provide scholastic materials, construct 8 units of teachers' accommodation, 40 stances of latrines and 15 classrooms with offices. ECW has also supported WIU to train 272 teachers on Psychosocial support, pedagogy, thematic curriculum, Innovation in teaching and learning and contentious assessment and recruited 15 trained teachers to improve teacher-learner ratio.

Enabel

WIU with support from Enabel provided 360 learners, youth and women in the communities of Adjumani and Kiryandongo with Vocational Skills Training to empower the beneficiaries with Market Oriented skills in five trades: Tailoring, Bakery, Cookery, Metal Fabrication and Hair Dressing.

Arizona State University (ASU).

WIU in partnership with ASU Piloted training on agribusiness in Nakivale in which 30 participants were trained and graduated with a Certificate in Economics of the Allocation of Resources Course in Nakivale Refugee settlement under the Education for Humanity: Powered by SolarSPELL university wide initiative.
