AREAS OF OPERATION

Windle International Uganda (WIU) operates in 12 settlements and education management is fully operational in 11 settlement within 10 Districts of Isingiro, Kamwenge, Kyegegwa, Hoima, Kiryandongo, Adjumani, Moyo, Lamwo, Arua and Kampala as the Headquarters.

Our regional offices are located in Adjumani, Hoima, Arua and Mbarara and the settlement office locations are distributed as follows:

- •SOUTH WEST: Nakivale, Oruchinga, Kyaka II and Rwamwanja
- •MID-WESTERN: Kiryandongo and Kyangwali
- •NORTHERN UGANDA: Adjumani, Palorinya & Palabek
- •WEST NILE: Rhino Camp and Imvepi



SCHOLARSHIP HIGHLIGHTS

- •395 children with Special Needs were identified and are being
- •supported to go to school and **2,274** orphans and vulnerable children are on the OVC scholarship.
- •16 (14M & 2F) students are currently on the Vocational scholarship under Windle International UK in Imvepi and Bidibidi Refugee settlements.
- •431 (299M & 132F) students are currently on the DAFI Scholarships Program.
- •35 (21M & 14F) new students have joined WUSC scholarship for the year 2020/21 with an overall total of 56 (36M & 29F) students on the programme and 21 (15M & 6F) currently in Canada.
- •5 (3M & 2F) students are currently on the UK Masters Scholarship
- •72 (43M & 29F) beneficiaries of the DAFI scholarship programme successfully graduated from various local universities within Uganda.



AUXILIARY PROJECTS AND OTHER HIGHLIGHTS

Windle International Uganda signed a partnership agreement with the European

Union in Uganda to implement the Skills for Employment Project (SEP) in three rural districts of Koboko, Yumbe, and Obongi in WestNile Uganda.

The Skills for Employment Project will strengthen accessibility, quality, relevance, and equity of vocational skills training for marginalized youth and young women in the target area, and support young people to convert vocational education into meaningful self-employment through enterprise development. The overall objective of this project is to increase access to sustainable employment opportunities for the host community and refugee youth.

EDUCATION CANNOT WAIT (ECW)

WIU with support from Education Cannot Wait distributed 35,538 branded exercise books (96 pages) to schools supported in Kyangwali Refugee Settlement.

CONVOY OF HOPE

WIU with support from Convoy of Hope WIU provided food and feeding items to 29 ECD centres in Rhino Camp, Imvepi and Palorinya

ENABEL

Windle International Uganda in partnership with Uganda Manufacture's Association & Young Women's Christian Association passed out 49 nationals (17M & 32F) and 151 Refugees (34M & 117F) vocational Skills graduates and offered them business start-up kits.
