## AREAS OF OPERATION

Windle International Uganda (WIU) operates in **12** settlements and education management is fully operational in **11** settlement within **10** Districts of Isingiro, Kamwenge, Kyegegwa, Hoima, Kiryandongo, Adjumani, Moyo, Lamwo, Arua and Kampala as the Headquarters.

Our regional offices are located in Adjumani, Hoima, Arua and Mbarara and the settlement office locations are distributed as follows:

- **SOUTH WEST:** Nakivale, Oruchinga, Kyaka II and Rwamwanja
- **MID-WESTERN:** Kiryandongo and Kyangwali
- **NORTHERN UGANDA:** Adjumani, Palorinya & Palabek
- **WEST NILE:** Rhino Camp and Imvepi

## EDUCATION MANAGEMENT HIGHLIGHTS

Highlights of enrolment as of Quarter III;

• A total of **458** learners **342** Refugees (M: **217** & F: **125**) and **116** Nationals (M: **85** & F: **31**) have been enrolled in Vocational Training;

• **66** learners **60** Refugees (M: **49** & F: **11**) and **6** Nationals (M: **5** & F: **1**) have been enrolled, in the Community Technology Access Centers (CTA) for training,

## SCHOLARSHIP HIGHLIGHTS

• **395** children with Special Needs were identified and are being supported to go to school and **2,274** orphans and vulnerable children are on the OVC scholarship.

• **16 (15M & 1F)** students are currently on the Vocational scholarship under Windle International UK in Imvepi and Bidibidi Refugee settlements.

• **457 (295M & 162F)** students are currently on the DAFI Scholarships Program after **50** new scholarships were awarded in July/August .

• **5 (3M & 2F)** students are currently on Windle International UK Scholarships program in universities within Uganda.

• **53 (34M & 19F)** students are on the WUSC scholarship with **21 (15M & 6F)** currently in Canada and **32 (19M & 13F)** still in the process of resettlement to Canada.

• **5** students are currently on the UK Masters Scholarship

## AUXILIARY PROJECTS

• Rhino Camp High School Girls Dormitory was completed and is already in use.

### EDUCATION CANNOT WAIT (ECW)

• **5** blocks (**15 classrooms**) of semi-permanent classrooms have been constructed, **8** blocks of latrines for students (**40** latrine stances) and **2** blocks of **2** latrine stances for teachers have been constructed and **8** units of teachers' accommodation (which are occupied by **8** teachers (**4M & 4F**)) have been constructed in Kyaka II and Kyangwali and are all in use.

• **26,139** learners were supported with scholastic materials including exercise books, pens, pencils, and Geometry sets (P.5-P.7 classes only).

• Capacity building for **276** teachers in Kyaka II and Kyangwali was conducted in the areas of psychosocial support, teacher professionalism, pedagogy.

### ARTOLUSION

WIU in partnership with Artolusion conducted a 10 Day Capacity Building workshop with UNHCR with **20 (10F & 10M)** local artists participated both to nurture the development of art for youth between 14-25 years in Bidibidi Refugee Settlement.

### ENABEL

WIU with support from Enabel was able to conduct a 2nd intake of market oriented skills training for 105 learners, youth and women in the communities of Adjumani and Kiryandongo. The skills of trade include tailoring, bakery, cookery, metal fabrication and hair dressing.

In partnership with Uganda Manufacturers Association (UMA), WIU was able to place students from the 1st intake for internship with different entrepreneurs within Bweyale in all the five trades (hair dressing, metal fabrication, cookery, bakery and tailoring) .
