AREAS OF OPERATION

Windle International Uganda operates in 12 settlements and education management is fully operational in 11 settlement within 10 Districts of Isingiro, Kamwenge, Kyegegwa, Hoima, Kiryandongo, Adjumani, Moyo, Lamwo, Arua and Kampala as the Headquarters.

Our regional offices are located in Adjumani, Arua and Mbarara and the settlement office locations are distributed as follows:

•SOUTH WEST: Nakivale, Oruchinga, Kyaka II and Rwamwanja

•MID-WESTERN: Kiryandongo and Kyangwali

•NORTHERN UGANDA: Adjumani, Palorinya and Palabek

•WEST NILE: Rhino Camp and Imvepi



EDUCATION MANAGEMENT HIGHLIGHTS

Registration of candidates began for the 2020 examinations set to begin in 2021. Below is a table of registered candidates:

Compared to the number of candidates registered, 90% of the P7 candidates, 56% of the UCE candidates and 77% of the UACE candidates reported back to school for their third term in 2020.



SCHOLARSHIP HIGHLIGHTS

- •09 applicants for UK masters programme have been shortlisted for interviews in preparation to enroll students for the online masters programme in partnership with Liverpool School of Tropical Medicine in UK. The programme is expected to start in March 2021.
- **•DAFI 199** out of 208 final year students who reported back to university were successfully paid their allowances which included transport, accommodation and subsistence.
- •SRP Online Interviews for the 65 shortlisted students for the 3rd SRP cohort of 2020/2021 have been carried out.
- 23 students from the 2nd SRP Cohort departed for Canada on the 16th of December. 1 student remained behind after testing positive for Covid19, he is undergoing further treatment and once he has recovered, he will depart for Canada. Total students being supported are 24 (14 Male & 10 Female).



AUXILIARY PROJECTS AND OTHER HIGHLIGHTS

For the second year running, WIU has been named Best International Humanitarian Organization in providing Education of the Year 2020. The awards were presided over by the Vice-President of the Republic Uganda, H.E. Edward Ssekandi Kiwanuka who in his speech urged the visionaries to continue setting the pace as the best in the country. As he accepted the Award, WIU's Executive Director, James Aryam, said: "It is a huge honor for the organization, its partners, staff and stakeholders to be receiving the top award for the second year in a row. This award strengthens our vision and mission to providing access to quality education to our persons of concern and host community. Despite the COVID-19 pandemic which forced the Country to shut down all the education institutions early in the year, WIU continued to facilitate home learning initiatives to all its learners, by providing home learning materials, radio programming and home visits by teachers. A special thank you to our teachers, parents, beneficiaries and partners for the continued support and collaboration."

EDUCATION QUALITY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT (EQUIP)

WIU with support from LDS completed the construction of 18 classrooms in 5 of the most overcrowded primary schools (Nyarugugu, Misyera, Ruhoko, Nakivale, Kabahinda Primary schools), and 3 classrooms in Nakivale Secondary School. The classrooms were all furnished with 189 three seater desks and 189 single seater desks. The ICT lab in Nakivale Secondary School received 22 computer monitors, 10 computer tables and 30 computer stools. The project will also equip Nakivale VTC with training material to reach more students and youth in need of vocational training.



NAKIVALE MASK PROJECT

With support from UNHCR, Nakivale Vocational Training Center's tailoring and garment cutting department undertook a facemask production activity in November 2020, targeting production of 70,000 facemasks. To ensure quality work and faster production, the department called upon some of the best recent graduates and continuing students to participate facemasks production. Each participant earned extra income from this initiative.

This was a pilot commercial project aimed at empowering and equipping beneficiaries with commercial skills for self-sustainability. After a brief training mass production. The participants launched out into mass production. Apart from the additional skilling gained, participants were happy to earn significant volumes of money which boosted their income.
